Dates have been set, and arrangements have been made for our return to Cameroon. We will be leaving CA on July 3rd for N.C. where Daryl will be getting some training. From there we will proceed on to Cameroon. It's hard to imagine that it's only 3 months away. I do want to take this opportunity to thank many of you for all your encouraging words and prayers after I expressed my struggles with returning to Cameroon in our last newsletter. The daily routine living can be hard, stressful, tiresome, and lonely. It was not an easy thing to share. Afterwards, I was overwhelmed with encouragement from you. I am so thankful for how many of you understood me and encouraged me. I believe that in order to be best supported we need to be open and honest with our struggles so that you, our supporters, can know better how to pray for us. We are all one body. Our furlough time here has been VERY refreshing for me. We were able to spend time with many of you and be spiritually refreshed. I feel I am ready to go back. No doubt the readjustment will be difficult. Many of you have been VERY supportive in every way and we THANK YOU!!! We have a short time left with a busy schedule and still many things to do. Please continue to lift us up in your prayers.

### Our Support Needs a Boost (Many have asked, how is our support?)

Our Wycliffe support quota is about \$425/month below that needed to meet our expenses while living and working in Cameroon. The funding we raise covers costs such as normal living (rent, food, transport, etc.), retirement, medical and evacuation insurance, furlough air travel, social security taxes (15%), children's school fees, Wycliffe organizational overhead in USA and Cameroon (10%), etc.

So, we are inviting new ministry partners to join us, sharing in our ministry. And while recognizing that it is not possible for all, (and we are very grateful for the sacrifices already being made), there may be some current partners who'd be happy to increase their commitment. Please pray with us. Feel free to call or email us with questions.

### Special Projects Update:

**Laptop Replacement.** All the funding for this project has come in. Many thanks for the special gifts targeting this project.

**Aviation Training.** About 75% of the estimated \$3,500 expense has already been received. We are very grateful for the generosity we've experienced and we're trusting God for the balance.

**Upcoming travel related expenses.** Over the course of more than 4 years overseas, we had been setting aside funds specifically for the purpose of purchasing our air tickets to travel to the USA for our furlough and back again to Cameroon. Unfortunately, nobody could foresee the increase in airfares, (nor the arrival of a 5th family member ☺). The end result is that our travel account is short by approximately \$2,175.

Please pray for God's provision regarding these unmet expenses.
